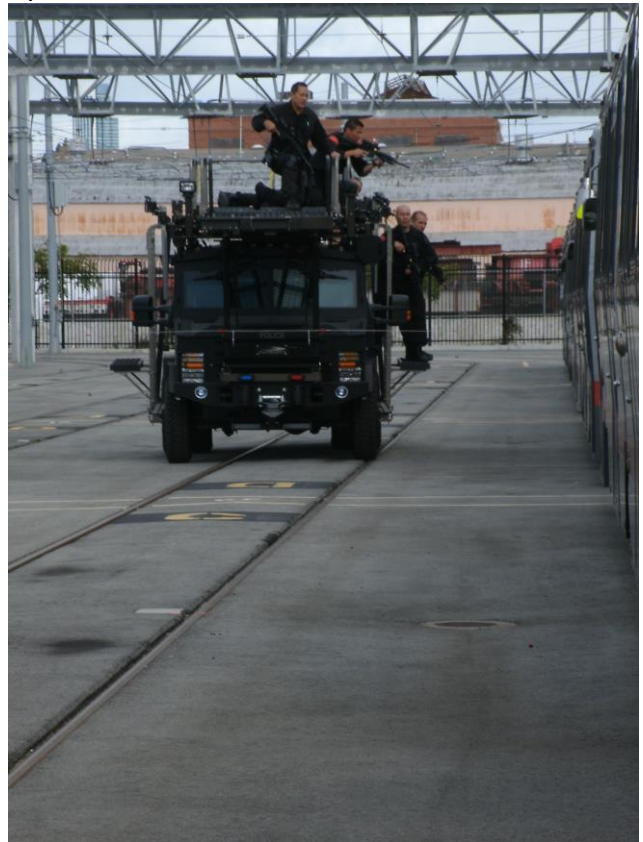

Tactical Ladder System

The Tactical Ladder System is an expandable ladder that extends beyond the reach of the ramp. It utilizes ladder segments that connect together via specialized hardware. The system allows for a ladder configuration up to 7 meters.

Tactical Ladder Turret

The Tactical Ladder Turret mounts anywhere on the ramp's high-traction surface and is designed to accept all length Tactical Ladders. A 360-degree rotating platform, the Tactical Ladder Turret enables the Tactical Ladders to stage perpendicular to the target regardless of the vehicles' angle of approach.

Fast Assault Suspension Tower

In the month of September the departments accomplished the following:

SANITATION DEPARTMENT

- The front loader trash truck is available to pick up the trash from those businesses that have other providers. The trash containers are in and a letter is being sent to those businesses that have other providers advising them of the necessary timeline to close their accounts with the other providers. Since the City refuse ordinance stipulates that the City has exclusive responsibility for garbage collection services, they will be picking up all businesses and residential trash.
- The Department continues to document on the containers that are left behind by using video cameras that were issued by the Information Technology Department. In doing so, I am glad to say residential complaints have diminished by 90%, and the department has justification on why trash was not picked up.
- There are two (2) employees assigned to checking garbage containers to ensure that the residents are getting billed appropriately. As for the North Alamo Residents, our city staff is finding that there are several residents that are paying for one container yet receiving city services for two (2) or more containers. The procedure is to verify with North Alamo Water the actual number of containers the resident is paying for, then our employees are sent to advise the customer and pick up the extra containers.
- Brush pickup for September 16 - 30 was two (2) days behind schedule due to the fact that a grapple truck broke down and it took approximately three weeks for the repairs to be completed. Another reason for the delay was that the only front loader that picks up businesses (before the burnt unit was repaired) and school trash, broke down for one (1) day, therefore, the grapple crew had to assist pulling out the trash from the containers and loading it into the grapple truck. Please note that the brush crew is also provided with a video camera and this has also helped with citizen's complaints. The crew continues to hand out the brush schedule to residents that cut their trees after the brush has been picked up. Residents are informed they can go to the City's web-site to find the brush schedule in English and Spanish. The Department is also providing a one-time and by doing so the brush complaints are at a minimum.
- Our Staff has also begun to mulch the brush that is free of debris and this has minimized the trip to the landfill, fuel cost, vehicle maintenance and travel time. Unfortunately, since the mulch is too large, it cannot be used at the parks nor wetlands. All residents will be notified that brush must be separated from the debris if it is not separated, brush will not be picked up. Our Staff will be advertising in the Advance News the schedule for brush pick up in order to provide better customer service.

CENTRAL GARAGE

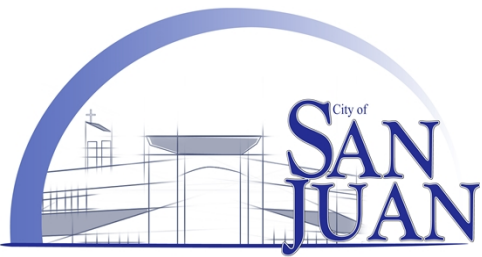
- Mechanics are providing all necessary maintenance on all City vehicles, tractor mowers and other heavy equipment. All vehicles are checked daily before workers begin their routes. The project to take a trash truck that has no use and convert it to a roll-off continuous. There is also a vehicle that was declared surplus three years ago and it has been converted into a trailer.
- The body and fender employee is also fixing broken 30 cubic yard containers, mowers, weedeaters and commercial containers. All in all we are making use of all equipment in one way or another.

STREETS DEPARTMENT

- The mowing crew is working on the main streets as-well-as residential areas. There are two (2) crews doing the right-of-ways one on the south and the north side.
- Repair of streets/alleys is continuous. The crew continues with repairing main streets and the residential neighborhoods. There is a crew assigned to repair the alley roads when necessary, cut trees and weedeating. Street signs are being replaced daily. Staff has been placing “No Dumping Signs”, speed limit signs on Hall Acres, speed bumps as well as street signs on Olive Street.
- The sweeper continues functioning on a daily basis in the City of San Juan. CDL employees are being trained on the sweeper as backups. The sweeper has been at Chula Vista, Short Road, North Gate, Nebraska, San Antonio and some residential side streets. Staff is looking into purchasing a used mechanical sweeper since one sweeper for the entire City is not enough.
- A crew was assigned to check all storm drains so that the storm drain map can be updated. A crew is also making sure that all inlets are clean and logos marked with blue paint.
- The street crew began to prepare the street next to Fire Station #2 by having the street cemented because of the heavy traffic flow.

MISCELLANEOUS

- I have an employee studying to get his vector license for fumigating and will be testing at the end of October. There is another employee that is also studying for the license and will be trained as the backup.
- Demolitions of dilapidated homes are now all complete; the last home took a little longer because of bee problems.
- Weather permitting; the Department will begin the Neighborhood Cleanup on October 21, 2017.
- The city shop is being cleared of all containers that are unrepairable and vehicles that have been declared surplus.

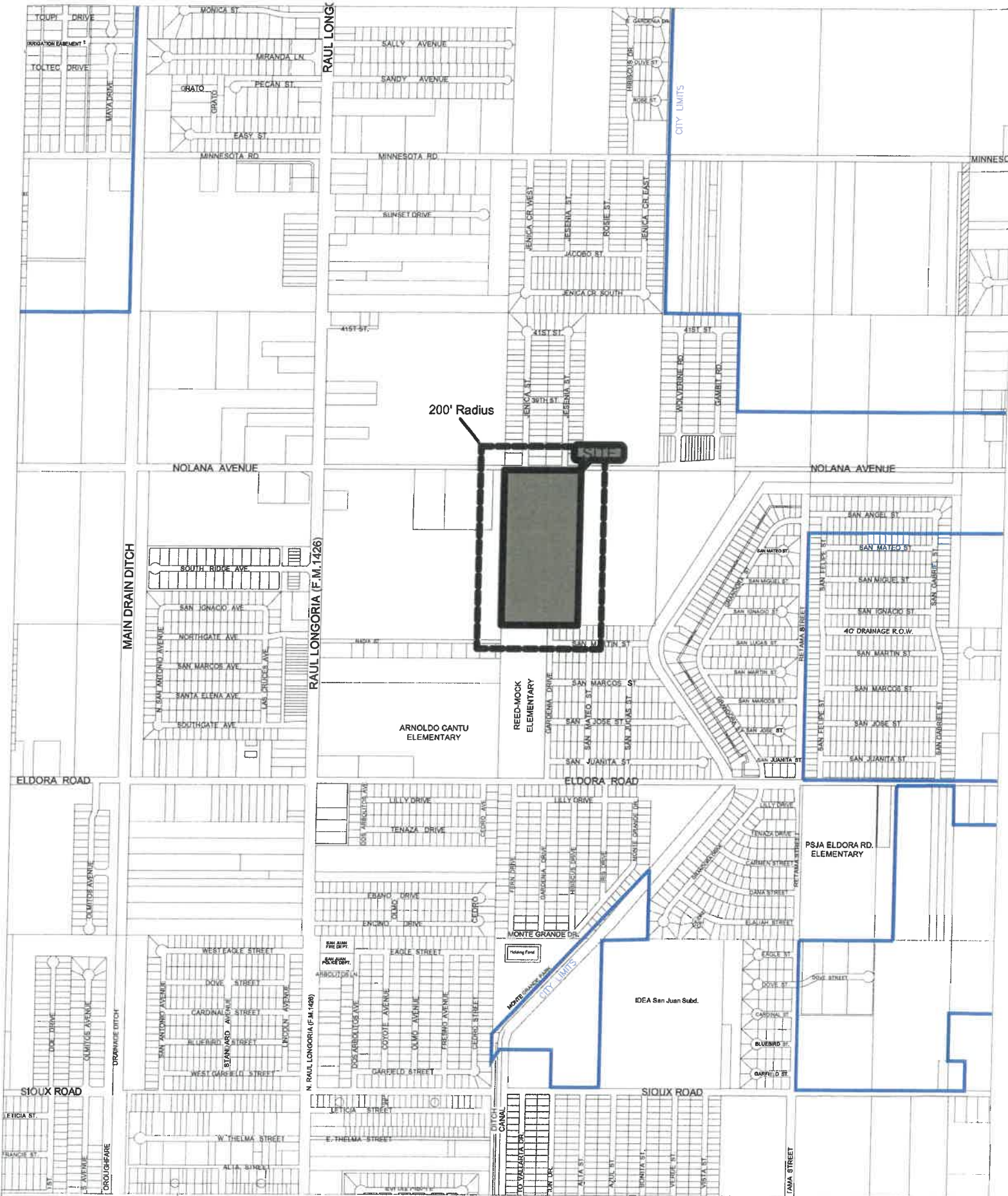

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SAN JUAN, TEXAS:

Consistent with the City's land use plan as set-forth in the land use map that is a part of the City's Zoning Ordinance, and consistent with the City's intentions of allowing and encouraging single-family development that generates property taxes, water and sewer revenues and sales tax revenues.

The zoning district of the property legally described as the West 20.0 acres out of Lot 1, Block 43, Alamo Land and Sugar Company's Subdivision, as shown as Exhibit "A" shall be changed from Multi-Family Residence District (R-MF) to Single-Family Residence District (R-S) and the zoning map shall be amended accordingly.

STAFF COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS:

During the 2017 Texas Legislative Session the Legislature approved Senate Bill (SB) 1004 amending Chapter 284 of the Texas Local Government Code regarding small cell antennas and related equipment within city right-of-ways. This bill went into effect on September 1, 2017.

SB 1004 granted wireless providers, a.k.a. as network providers, access to and the authority to construct, install and operate “network nodes” within the city right-of-ways. The bill also regulates the type of information a municipality may require as part of the permitting process, establishes a fee structure, and sets deadlines that municipalities must follow as part of the permitting process.

The proposed ordinance is to provide a framework for the deployment of network nodes and node support poles in the right-of-way by network providers in accordance to SB 1004.

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Planning Director to work with the City Attorney on a Right-of-Way Protection Ordinance.

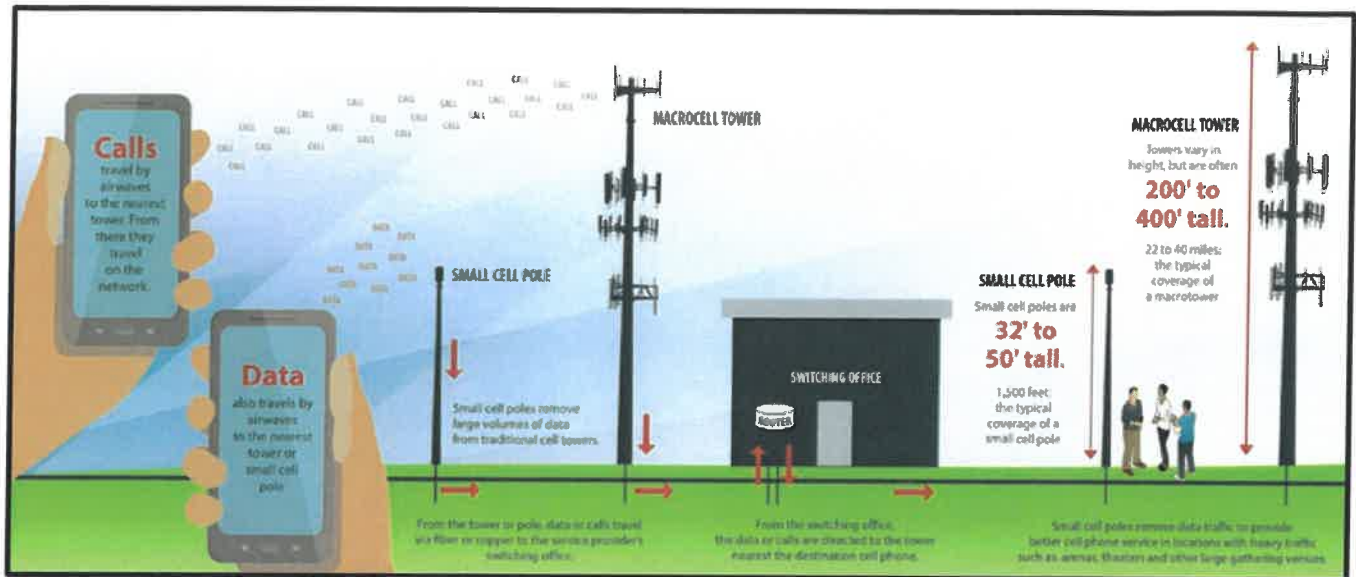

A RESOLUTION REQUESTING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD FOR CONSTRUCTING VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS TO THE CITY'S UTILITY SYSTEM; AUTHORIZING THE CITY'S FINANCIAL ADVISORS, BOND COUNSEL, AND ENGINEERS TO COORDINATE THE SUBMISSION OF THE APPLICATION TO THE TEXAS WATER DEVELOPMENT BOARD; AND OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH

WHEREAS, the City of San Juan, Texas (the *City*) deems it necessary to apply to the Texas Water Development Board (the *Board*) for financial assistance; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Board, which govern the procedures in making such an application, the governing body of the City is required to pass a resolution to accompany such application; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SAN JUAN, TEXAS THAT:

1. It is hereby found and determined that the City cannot reasonably finance the proposed project without the financial assistance of the Board in the amount requested.

2. The City hereby requests that the Board grant financial assistance to the City in the amount not to exceed \$7,000,000 (as a loan or by the purchase of obligations of the City and the receipt of the largest amount of grant funds lawfully available from the Board) for constructing improvements to the City's utility system, as designed by the City's Consulting Engineer (defined herein), and the purchase of the necessary land and rights-of-way relating to this project. These obligations may be issued by the City in one or more series.

3. The Mayor of the City is hereby authorized to execute and submit to the Board the application for such financial assistance, and the Mayor of the City, or his designee, together with Bond Counsel (defined herein), the Financial Advisor (defined herein), and the Consulting Engineer, each named in such application, are authorized to appear before the Board in support of such application.

4. The Mayor of the City is further specifically authorized to make the required assurances to the Board in accordance with the rules, regulations, and policies of the Board.

5. The City Commission authorizes the Mayor or the City Manager of the City, or the designee of any of the foregoing, to take all actions necessary to execute any necessary financial advisory contract with FirstSouthwest, a Division of Hilltop Securities Inc., as the financial advisor to the City (the *Financial Advisor*). The City Commission understands that under applicable federal securities laws and regulations that the City must have a contractual agreement with its Financial Advisor relating to the sale, issuance, and delivery of debt obligations of the City. In addition the City Commission also authorizes the Mayor or the City Manager of the City, or the

designee of any of the foregoing, to take all actions necessary to execute any necessary engagement agreement with Norton Rose Fulbright US LLP, as the bond counsel to the City (*Bond Counsel*). The City Commission has retained Cruz-Hogan Consultants, Inc. (the *Consulting Engineer*) as the consulting engineer to the City for this project. Execution of such engagement agreements also constitute a prerequisite to the City's filing of its application with the Board.

A certified copy of this Resolution shall be attached to the application for financial assistance herein authorized to be prepared and submitted to the Board, and the City Secretary of the City is authorized and directed to prepare and certify such number of copies of this Resolution as may be required for purposes of supporting the submission of such application to the Board.

6. The recitals contained in the preamble hereof are hereby found to be true, and such recitals are hereby made a part of this Resolution for all purposes and are adopted as a part of the judgment and findings of the City.

7. All ordinances and resolutions, or parts thereof, which are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Resolution shall be and remain controlling as to the matters resolved herein.

8. This Resolution shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas and the United States of America.

9. If any provision of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance shall be held to be invalid, the remainder of this Resolution and the application of such provision to other persons and circumstances shall nevertheless be valid, and the City hereby declares that this Resolution would have been enacted without such invalid provision.

10. **INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF SAN JUAN,
TEXAS AND THE COUNTY OF HIDALGO, TEXAS**

THIS Agreement is made on this the 26 day of September, 2017, by and between the **CITY OF SAN JUAN, TEXAS**, hereinafter referred to as "San Juan", and the **COUNTY OF HIDALGO, TEXAS**, hereinafter referred to as "County", pursuant to the provisions of the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, as follows:

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, San Juan is a home rule municipality located in Hidalgo County, Texas;

WHEREAS, County is a county in the State of Texas;

WHEREAS, San Juan and County, each pursuant to its statutory and constitutional authority, are responsible for maintenance and improvements of certain public roadways within their boundaries;

WHEREAS, San Juan and County desire to undertake certain reconstruction of roadway and drainage improvements to a portion of Minnesota Road from Raul Longoria Road to 265' feet West of Cesar Chavez Road consisting of approximately 6,527 linear feet of which 2,836 feet, lies within San Juan and 3,691 linear feet lies within the County (the "Road");

WHEREAS, the Road forms an integral part of the County road system and the improvements to the Road are in the best interest of both the County and San Juan;

WHEREAS, San Juan and County are authorized to enter into this Agreement pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Texas Gov't. Code 791.001 et seq., which authorizes local governments to contract with each other to perform governmental functions and services under the terms of the Act, and pursuant to the County Road and Bridge Act which authorizes counties to improve roadways within the limits of a city with the city's consent.

NOW, THEREFORE, San Juan and County, in consideration of the mutual covenants expressed hereinafter, agree as follows:

1. The parties agree to cooperate in making the necessary improvements to the Road as described herein.

2. County agrees to provide all labor, machinery and material necessary for reconstruction of the Road.
3. County will, to the extent reasonably possible, follow the County's standard specifications for reconstruction of the Road improvements unless otherwise agreed in writing by both parties.
4. Any and all costs deemed necessary for the improvements to the Road such as engineering services shall be sole expense by the County.
5. San Juan and County will coordinate work schedules in order to provide for minimal disruption to the public and will complete the road improvements no later than one hundred fifty (150) days from execution of this Agreement.
6. San Juan pursuant to Tex. Trans. Code § 251.012, authorizes County to perform the work described herein.
7. **Conflict with Applicable Law.** Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed so as to require the commission of any act contrary to law, and whenever there is any conflict between and provision of their Agreement and any present or future law, ordinance or administrative, executive or judicial regulation, order or decree, or amendment thereof, contrary to which the parties have no legal right to contract, the latter shall prevail, but in such event the affected provision or provision of this Agreement shall be modified only to The extent necessary to bring them within the legal requirements and only during the times such conflict exists.
8. **No Waiver.** No waiver by any party hereto of any breach of any provision of the Agreement shall be deemed to be a waiver of any preceding or succeeding breach of the same or any other provision hereof.
9. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement contains the entire contract among the parties hereto, and each party acknowledges that neither has made (either directly or through any agent or representative) any representation or agreement in connection with this Agreement not specifically set forth herein. This Agreement may be modified or amended only by agreement in writing executed by San Juan and County, and not otherwise.
10. **Texas Law to Apply.** This Agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, and all obligations of the parties created hereunder are performable in Hidalgo County, Texas. The parties hereby consent to personal jurisdiction in Hidalgo County, Texas.
11. **Notice.** Except as may be otherwise specifically provided in this Agreement, all notices, demands, requests or communication required or permitted hereunder shall be in writing and shall either be (i) personally delivered against a written receipt, or (ii) sent by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage

prepaid and addressed to the parties at the addresses set forth below, or at such other addresses as may have been theretofore specified by written notice delivered in accordance herewith:

Each notice, demand, request or communication which shall be delivered or mailed in the manner described above shall be deemed sufficiently given for all purposes at such time as it is personally delivered to the addressee or, if mailed, at such time as it is deposited in the United States mail.

12. **Additional Documents.** The parties hereto covenant and agree that they will execute such other and further instruments and documents as are or may become necessary or convenient to effectuate and carry out the terms of this Agreement.
13. **Successors.** This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors, and assigns where permitted by this Agreement.
14. **Assignment.** This Agreement shall not be assignable.
15. **Headings.** The headings and captions contained in this Agreement are solely for convenience reference and shall not be deemed to affect the meaning or interpretation of any provision of paragraph hereof.
16. **Gender and Number.** All pronouns used in this Agreement shall include the other gender, whether used in the masculine, feminine or neuter gender, and singular shall include the plural whenever and so often as may be appropriate.
17. **Authority to Execute.** The execution and performance of this Agreement by McAllen and County have been duly authorized by all necessary laws, resolutions or corporate action, and this Agreement constitutes the valid and enforceable obligations of McAllen and County in accordance with its terms.

18. **Governmental Purpose.** Each party hereto is entering into this agreement for the purpose of providing for governmental services or functions and will pay for such services out of current revenues available to the paying party as herein provided.

19. **Commitment of Current Revenues Only.** In the event that, during any term hereof, the governing body of any party does not appropriate sufficient funds to meet the obligations of such party under this Agreement, then any party may terminate this Agreement upon ninety (90) days written notice to the other party. Each of the parties hereto agrees, however, to use its best efforts to secure funds necessary for the continued performance of this Agreement. The parties intend this provision to be a continuing right to terminate this Agreement at the expiration of each budget period of each party hereto pursuant to the provisions of Tex. Loc. Govt. Code Ann. §271.903.
